

"Fast Food" mix tape review

1. Intro-Normal intro

2. Walk Through The Streets- Right away the production jumps out it has a 70's vibe. Fatts comes out and explains why he calls this mix tape "Fast Food" and he rides the beat nicely.

3. Darkside- This track I just keep picturing DMX "Where My Hood at" the flow is even similar. I like what Fatts is saying but I am also a fan of being original and this is too much like DMX for me.

4. Microphone-My head start bobbing instantly, I love the old school direction were heading. I like the flow and the way Fatts tells a story that I can picture. I can see him on stage rapping this song and getting the fans to engage.

5. Learn 2 Love- The sample is crazy and again it's very apparent that Fatts can really tell a story and make a listener vibe to what he is saying. You hear a lot of artists talking about how they got that woman who is down for the game but it's very rare you can honestly picture that it's real. In this track you can!!

6. Receipt- To be honest I really had to listen to this track 3 times to really to get the full vibe of the track. I think this is the first time I have heard an artist talk about getting over a girl, backstabbers, etc. as a

8. Confusion-I can't say this enough I love the production. Lyrics are on point but a bit of a step down from "I'm On"

9. King Me-"Them haters are like Jada they done lost their Will" bars. Fatts brings it back with the lyrics, hot track.

11. Love Don't Live Here- I like the track but I don't like the feature. With a track like this again the concept has been done so much you have to bring something different and the way Fatts rhymes does bring that but D-Boy Danny has a monotone flow and you he doesn't rhyme within the beat so you don't feel what he is saying.

12. Get It- For the first time on this mix tape I was very disappointed. Mainly because I feel like Fatts dubbed down his lyrics to try and make an anthem. The hook is very basic and so are the bars. I truly feel Fatts can murda a beat like this without toning himself down.

13. Soulful Rebuttal- As soon as I am like damn he brings it back to storytelling. Fatts is a lot like Jeezy where he can tell these rough

stories and you can just see everything right in front of you. "I got a futuristic flow like a PS4, I been here since the Genesis, just like a Sega"

14. Tears of Joy- I love the Belly reference. Artists can learn from this track when I say he rode the beat this track shows it perfectly. The beat and the lyrics are building up to a climax just like a book does and then #Pow and you're like I feel you fam. That is how you make a hot track and shows Fatts can make a classic which is so hard to do.

15. The Cool- This is a perfect performance track and I say that because I can see people throwing their hands up and riding with the track. The hook is money for performing. I can actually see hip-hop head riding out with this.

16. Pimping In The Parking Lot-This reminds me a bit of UGK. Again though I am not fan of the features I just feel like they are not on the level of Fatts but it's a cool track.
